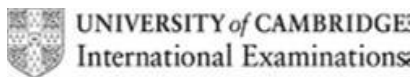

Acceptable Reasons for Late Arrivals:

- Sudden Illness
- Accident en route to exam
- Transportation difficulty beyond Candidate's control.



Unacceptable Reasons for Late Arrivals:

- Misreading the Timetable
- Oversleeping



Unauthorized Items in Exam Hall:

- Statement of Entry
- Mobile Phones/Electronics Device/Smart Watches
- Calculator covers
- Instruction Sheets
- Rough/Tracing/Tissue Paper
- Paper labels and Eraser Covers

Dress Code:

- Full long Pants
- T-shirts with sleeves
- Covered shoes
- Jackets
- No caps/hats in exam hall

1. What are the Deadlines for Registration?

4. What time should I report for examinations?

For **Oral/Speaking Test**, please report 30 minutes before your respective slot.

For the **Written Examinations**, reporting times are as follows:

AM Session – by 8:00 am

PM Session – by 12:00 pm

All Candidates **MUST** report at the above timings, although the exam that you are sitting for is a few hours later. You must be quarantined away from electronic communications devices to avoid getting an advantage over other candidates around the world (who have completed their exams and are discussing the answers online).

5. What should I wear for the examination?

For the Cambridge Exams, Candidates are required to observe smart casual attire. The following are allowed:

- T-Shirts with Sleeves
- Long Pants/J Jeans
- Skirts (Knee length or longer)
- Shoes

Candidates are encouraged to bring a jacket or sweater as it can become quite cold in the exam hall.

Strictly not allowed:

- Slippers or Sandals
- Shorts
- Spaghetti strapped/sleeveless blouses
- Ripped/torn Jeans

First time offenders will be warned and repeat offenders may be barred from sitting for the exam until properly attired.

6. What should I bring for the examination?
- i. IC (Very important, candidates will not be allowed to sit for the exam without it. Statement of Entry is not sufficient)
 - ii. Stationery in a clear transparent casing
 - iii. Calculator (If permitted)/geometrical instruments
 - iv. Transparent water bottles

7. Why is it important to leave a valid email address and phone number?

Our main means of communication to the candidates and parents is through Email. We send out Announcements, Instructions and Statements of Entry. Not having a valid email address means missing out on this extra service.

Do note that it is still the candidate's responsibility to be aware of the dates of their exams, and that "having not received any email" is not a valid reason to be late or absent from any examination.

8. Why is the "First Language English?" field reflected as not specified in the Statement of Entry, even though the candidate is sitting for the First Language English Paper?

This was an optional field to supply to Cambridge. As such, we chose not to include this information when uploading the candidate's details. This will not be reflected anywhere else aside from the Statement of Entry.

9. Why does my Statement of Entry show an exempted component even though I am taking an exemption?

The Statement of Entry shows all components of a subject and doesn't reflect whether a candidate is taking an exemption. A letter confirming that we have applied for the exemption of your syllabus component will be sent to you later on.

Notice to Candidates

Make sure you know the rules before you take your examinations.

1. You **must** be on time for all your examinations and any required periods of supervision.
2. You **must** provide what you need e.g. pens, pencils and rulers.
3. You **may** use a calculator unless you are told not to do so. You **must not** use the calculator function of another device.
4. You **must not** become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice before, during or after the examination.
5. You **must not**:
 - sit an examination in the name of another candidate
 - have in your possession any unauthorised material, including electronic devices and mobile phones
 - have in your possession any equipment which might give you an unfair advantage.



6. Possession of **a mobile phone or other** unauthorised material is breaking the rules, even if you do not intend to use it. If found in possession of unauthorised material, you will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification.
7. You **must not** talk to, attempt to communicate with or disturb other candidates once you have entered the examination room.
8. You **must** follow the instructions of the invigilator.
9. If you are in any doubt speak to the invigilator.
10. You **must**, when leaving the examination room, leave behind the question paper, your answer book or answer paper, rough work and any other (used or unused) materials.
